



WOFA station in Vienna was housed in a former private building (belonging to [Anthony van Hoboken](#) - a famous musicologist) on [Schreiberweg 45/47](#) from the very beginning until it got closed down in 1955.

The transmitter was erected on the neighbouring estate on Schreiberweg 43. This location, at the hills of Kahlenberg, enabled BDN to service the whole city with its program and hence was an enormous advantage to the other stations - especially to the Soviet controlled RAVAG (which was located in the city).
